Spring Workshop





Requiem by Eleanor Daley incorporates texts such as the one above and will be sung by the **Chancel Choir** on Good Friday, March 25. This worship service will include hymns, readings and music from Daley's Requiem and will begin at 7 pm. On Easter Sunday, March 27, the Chancel Choir will sing two anthems with strings...Rejoice In The Lord by Handel and Psalm 150 by César Franck. César Franck is most known for his contribution to organ repertoire, however, Psalm 150 and Panis Angelicus, also known as O Lord Most Holy, are staples in choral music libraries.

The work will begin soon and will take about six months to complete. The cost of the new niches will be \$900 now until end of construction (up to 68 niches) and \$1,150 after construction.
