Strategic Planning UPDATE

For those of you who have ever participated in a strategic planning process, you are well aware of how the process can feel more like working a jigsaw puzzle than plotting a course forward. The Church Council, our Pastors, ministry area Directors, Lay Leaders, and key staff members have been actively and prayerfully putting the puzzle pieces together to formulate a plan that will guide Wesley Memorial into the year 2020 and beyond. We are using a tool called The Golden Circle (Simon Sinek) to help us focus our work. This tool asks 3 simple questions WHY? HOW? and WHAT?



WHY does the church/Wesley Memorial exist?

Answer: **TO MAKE DISCIPLES**

HOW will Wesley Memorial make disciples?

Answer: By emphasizing 4 priority, spiritual disciplines: **WORSHIP, PRAYER, SMALL GROUPS, and HANDS-ON MISSION**

In August, the Church Council received a report outlining an approach of **HOW** Wesley Memorial will emphasize these disciplines in our mission **TO MAKE DISCIPLES**. During the next two months, we will be working on the third and final question in the model **WHAT** will this look like? The final results coming in the form of a "Strategic Plan" will be presented to the Charge Conference scheduled for Tuesday, November 15. 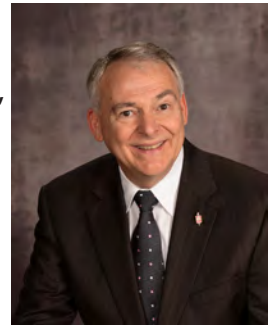

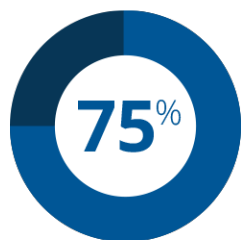

Third Quarter Giving Statements

Save the Date! Election Night Communion

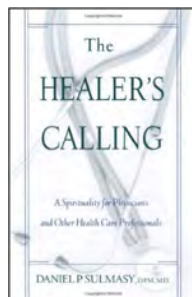

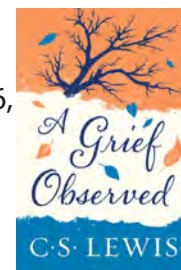
Healthcare Professionals Book Discussion Group October 11

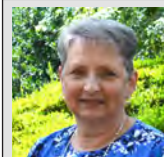
