LIVE ALIVE EVENTS KICK OFF THIS TUESDAY

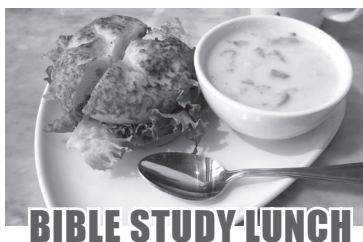

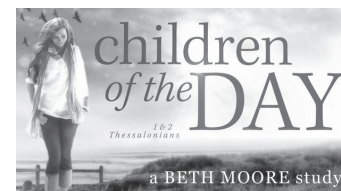
