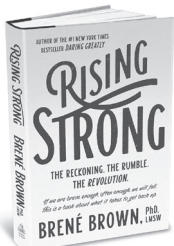
DON'T MISS OUT ON DAILY ADVENT EMAIL DEVOTIONALS THAT BEGIN TOMORROW!
